# Notes

Heinrich Schütz (1585-1672) wrote the *Musikalische Exequien*, opus 7 (SWV 279-281) for the funeral of Prince Heinrich Posthumus von Reuss (1572-1635). Prince Heinrich's widow and sons commissioned the work upon his death, and provided Schütz with Bible verses as the text, which were also inscribed on the prince's coffin. The last two parts of the *Musikalische Exequien* have been arranged for trombone octet in two different choirs.

- Motet (SWV 280), “Herr, wenn ich nur dich habe” (“Lord, if I have but Thee”), is set for two equal choirs reflecting Schütz’s studies with Giovanni Gabrieli from 1609-1612. The declamatory style and imitation between the two choirs emphasizes the conviction of salvation and comfort expressed in the text.

*Herr, wenn ich nur dich habe,  
so frage ich nichts nach Himmel und Erden.  
Wenn mir gleich Leib und Seele verschmacht’,  
so bist du doch, Gott,

- In Canticum Simeonis (SWV 281), Schütz uses the familiar words of the *Nunc dimittis* (*Herr, nun lässtest du deinen Diener*, “Lord, now You let Your servant”) in Chorus I, accompanied by a second, smaller choir singing portions of *Revelations* and the *Wisdom of Solomon*. The second choir, arranged here for two alto trombones and bass trombone, was, as Schütz wrote, “to indicate in some small measure the joy of the disembodied blessed souls in heaven, in the company of the heavenly spirits and holy angels.”<sup>1</sup>
