THE WORK: Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706) was an organist at Nuremberg and Erfurt in Germany. He was especially renowned for his vocal music, fugues, variations (chaconnes and passacaglias), and canons. The canon is the most strict form of imitative composition. This Canon is made up of a series of melodic variations (specifically a passacaglia) over a repeated bass line (ground bass). This work is originally for organ or another keyboard instrument but is more famous as a transcription for three violins and continuo. This piece has been arranged many times over for many different ensembles including brass quintet, brass choir, string quartet, string orchestra, woodwind quintet, woodwind choir, hand bell choir, kazoo quartet, and even an electronic synthesized version.

THE TRANSCRIPTION: Pachelbel's Canon..... for the Trombone? This is one of my favourite pieces of music and I decided not to let my instrument get in the way of playing this lovely piece. The original key of this piece is D major but I put it in B flat to facilitate the range and key of the trombone. I arranged this work for four equal trombones (as opposed to three tenors and a bass trombone) so I could move the bass line around. The bass line is predominantly in the fourth part. However, all players get a crack at this serene and simple melody. This transcription requires that all four players must have an F-attachment on their trombones - this is to play the aforementioned bass line as well as facilitate some of the more technical passages in the work. Tempo should be very strict, pay attention so that the piece doesn't drag. Hear the bass line in all parts. Because the bass line moves through all four parts, careful attention must be given so that it is consistently played the same throughout. The same should be applied to all the melodies throughout the course of the work. The piece is very imitative and therefore all melodies should be played consistently by each player. Watch for tuning and articulation especially in the low range of the instrument. All trills are optional and articulations can be modified to the liking of the performers.
